**LAW
ON SUPPLEMENT TO THE LAW ON CLASSIFIED
INFORMATION**

Article 1

In the Law on Classified Information ("Official Gazette of the Republic of Macedonia", no. 9/2004, 113/2007, 145/10, 80/12 and 41/14), in Article 51 after paragraph 1 new paragraphs 2 and 3 are added, as follows:

"As an exception to paragraph 1 of this article, the third level security vetting for the persons appointed in the supervisory bodies that supervise the application of the measures for monitoring of communications, as well as for the accredited national and international technical experts belonging to those bodies, in line with the Law on Monitoring of Communications, lasts for one month from the date of submitting the request.

As an exception to paragraph 1 of this article, the second level security vetting for the persons before getting employment at the Operative and Technical Agency, lasts for one month from the date of submitting the request."

Paragraph 2 becomes paragraph 4.

Article 2

This Law shall enter into force on the eighth day from the day of its publication in the "Official Gazette of the Republic of Macedonia".
